



Since 2010, the Junior Entrepreneur Programme (or JEP) has given more than 50,000 primary school pupils on the island of Ireland the opportunity to experience practical, real-life business learning as part of their formative education.

Running over a 12 to 16 week period during the school year, JEP nurtures creativity, independence and problem-solving among pupils of all abilities, with every aspect of the Programme seamlessly blending into the primary school curriculum. JEP doesn't interrupt your child's education – it enhances it.

The children in 4th, 5th and 6th class are taking part in the Junior Entrepreneur Programme this year. Together as a class, and with the inspiration of participating local entrepreneurs, the children have chosen their team project: ADA Log Design Company. A.D.A. stands for 'Adam, Dylan and Alex'. A.D.A. believes that decorative logs should not only be associated with Christmas. They design and customise logs for all special occasions.










Cloghogue Parent's Association
